# Rescue Relief Fund

- Applications for benefits from the Fund shall be made to the Secretary-Treasurer under the following conditions and procedure: Within 180 days after the contracting of a disease or the occurrence of accident for which benefits are sought, the chief or chief officer of the local department shall notify the Secretary-Treasurer in writing that the person applying for benefits is a member of the Fund and request the necessary forms from the Secretary-Treasurer's office to be submitted for the benefits. (1987, c. 584, s. 5.)

Eligible Rescue and EMS Workers

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- Monetary Support (began Jan 2016) (Rescue Relief Fund)
  - 10% of weekly salary for death in-line-of-duty. <u>Notification must be made to</u> <u>the office within 180 days of occurrence and paperwork completed within 210</u> <u>days.</u>
- Disability Income (Relief Fund) <u>Notification must be made to the office within 180 days of occurrence and paperwork completed within 210 days.</u>
  - 10% of weekly salary when injured in-line-of-duty. Must notify NCAR&EMS within 180 days of injury. Must be nonambulatory Application must be made. Administered by the NCAR&EMS.

Eligible Rescue and EMS Workers

- Children of Member Scholarships (Rescue Relief Fund)
  - 30 \$9,500.00 scholarships awarded − (2 year, transfer to 4 year school)
  - $\propto$  30 \$15,000.00 scholarships awarded (4 year school)
  - $\propto$  30 \$ 2,000.00 scholarships awarded (2 years school)
  - Scholarship recipients must attend a school with location in NC.

Applicants must apply by March 31 in the year they graduate from high school or the next year following high school graduation. Parents must be an eligible Rescue or EMS worker. On-Line Applications are available on our website from January 1 to March 31 each year.

### Members pay yearly dues

<u>Notification must be received within 180 days of event for Death, Dismemberment, and Monetary</u> <u>Compensation benefits. (Rescue Relief Fund)</u>

- Accidental Death & Dismemberment (If there is no qualifying spouse, then payment shall be made to any surviving dependent child and if there is more than one surviving dependent child, then said payment shall be made to and equally divided among all surviving children. If there is no spouse and no dependent child or children, then the payment shall be made in equal payments to the dependent parent or parents. If there is no dependent parent or parents, then payment shall be made to the estate of the deceased.)
  - CR Death Benefit <u>\$20,000.00</u> Coverage is 24 hours a day. (Administered by the NCAR&EMS)
  - Dismemberment <u>Up to \$20,000</u> Coverage is 24 hours a day. (Administered by NCAREMS)
- Natural Death (Same qualified recipient as accidental death)
  - R \$1000.00
- Monetary Compensation
  - R \$200.00
  - Member must show evidence to type of natural or man made catastrophe or proof of monetary loss. Must have a minimum estimated loss of \$1000.00. Does not include motor vehicle crashes.

### Members pay yearly dues.



 Member Scholarships (Rescue Relief Fund)
 30 - \$4,000.00 scholarships awarded (4 year schools)
 30 - \$2,000.00 scholarships awarded (2 year schools)
 Applicants must be a NCAR&EMS members. On-Line Applications are available on our website from January 1 to March 31 each year.

### Members pay yearly dues.



Scholarships – for a spouse of in-line-of-duty death victim. (Rescue Relief Fund)

- R Spouse may choose a two (2) or four (4) year school.
- R Two (2) year school \$2,000.00.
- R Four (4) year school \$15,000.00.

### Note for Retired Members

To maintain association benefits they must remain a dues paying members (either by a department or individual) and meet one of the following criteria.

20 years of service as eligible Rescue & EMS worker.
Disabled with:

- G months of service (In Line of Duty related)

- C Death Benefit is \$5,000.00 (effective May15, 2016) which is payable upon death of a member to the designated beneficiary in the fund. (Benefit increases \$1,000.00 with each increase in membership of 1,000.)
- 🕫 \$4.00 Join fee
- Monthly Assessments for Deaths \$1/death of a BH member
- A Join within 5yrs of joining Association unless entire department joins and before age 65.

# **On-Duty Fatality Defined**

 On-duty fatalities include any injury or illness sustained while on-duty that proves fatal.

# **On-Duty Defined**



The term 'on-duty' refers to being involved in operations at the scene of an emergency, whether it is a fire or non-fire incident; responding to or returning from an incident; performing other official duties such as training, maintenance, public education, inspection, and investigations.

# What We Will Not Do...



- We will not come if we have not been requested to come.
- We will not disseminate information unless cleared by the chief and family.
- We will not give out inaccurate information.

## **Assistance Team**



- A response team of two N.C. OSFM personnel will arrive within 24 hours, if needed.
- They will need access to a telephone, fax machine, table, etc.
- They will stay as long as you need them.

## Considerations



 Communicate to the family the need for an autopsy to be performed and blood samples to be taken.

*Why?* A cause of death must be determined in order to avoid a delay in receiving federal benefits.

# **Additional Considerations**



- Secure all PPE and anything that could be a contributing factor to the death.
- Appoint someone to handle the press/media.
- Have a press release prepared.

- State Death Benefits \$50,000.00
- North Carolina State Firemen's Association Line of Duty Death \$50,000 and \$25,000 AD&D
- N.C. Society of Fire/Rescue Service Instructors \$10,000

# N. C. State Firemen's Association

- In addition, a seat belt benefit of \$10,000 will be paid.
- Full scholarships for college education provided for any dependent child. These scholarships essentially cover all expenses except spending money.

#### N. C. State Firemen's Assoc. Fraternal Insurance

 Accidental Death and Dismemberment will pay the following:

35 and under	\$ 40,000.00
36 - 40	\$ 30,000.00
41 – 45	\$ 20,000.00

#### **Possible Benefits**



- Local Relief Fund
- Pension Fund Reimbursement (Monies paid into fund)
- Any department benefits, such as VFIS, Brotherhood Term Life, etc.
- Each year the chief should review all benefits the department has with its members.

#### State Death Benefit




 This benefit pays a total of \$50,000. The state will pay this benefit regardless of survivors. If there are none, then the claim is paid to the estate.


#### State Death Benefit

 As of July 1, 2003, when a firefighter dies as the direct and proximate result of a heart attack suffered while on duty, within 24 hours after participating in a training exercise, or responding to an emergency situation, the fireman is presumed to have been killed in the line of duty.


Monetary Support 10% of average wage for 180 days.



- Dismemberment up to \$20,000 and/or Accidental Death (coverage is 24 hours a day) \$20,000.
- Natural deaths pay \$1,000.



- BENEVOLENT BROTHERHOOD. Must be a member.
- Death benefit is \$5,000 which is payable upon death of a member in the fund. (Benefit increases \$1,000 with each increase in membership of 1,000.)



 A spouse and/or dependent(s) of a line of duty death are eligible to receive scholarships and have choice of:

GaTwo year scholarship of \$2,000
GaFour year scholarship of \$15,000

### Worker's Compensation

- This benefit is calculated at a specific rate equaling 2/3 of his/her weekly wages for 500 weeks.
- Presently the maximum rate is \$862 for career emergency personnel and a minimum rate of \$574.70 (2/3 of the maximum) for volunteer emergency personnel.

### Worker's Compensation

- Benefits for minor age beneficiaries are also figured for 500 weeks or until age of 18, whichever is longer.
- Part-time emergency personnel rate would be based on the salary paid for those part-time hours worked.

#### **FRSW** Pension Fund



- LODD Survivor Benefit & Beneficiary Designation <u>Provisions</u>
  - <u>The NC General Assembly enacted Senate Bill 886</u> (Session Law 2016-108), which created a new monthly FRSWPF survivorship benefit if the member dies in the line of duty on or after June 1, 2016, and new beneficiary designation provisions effective July 1, 2018.

# **PSOB** Payments

(1) if there is no child who survived the public safety officer, to the surviving spouse of the public safety officer;(2) if there is at least 1 child who survived the public safety officer and a surviving spouse of the public safety officer, 50 percent to the surviving child (or children, in equal shares) and 50 percent to the surviving spouse;(3) if there is no surviving spouse of the public safety officer, to the surviving child (or children, in equal shares) and 50 percent to the surviving spouse;(3) if there is no surviving spouse of the public safety officer, to the surviving child (or children, in equal shares)

# **PSOB** Payments

(4) if there is no surviving spouse of the public safety officer and no surviving 02 child—(A) to the surviving individual (or individuals, in shares per the designation, or, otherwise, in equal shares) designated by the public safety officer to receive benefits under this subsection in the most recently executed designation of beneficiary of the public safety officer on file at the time of death with the public safety agency, organization, or unit; or(B) if there is no individual qualifying under subparagraph (A), to the surviving individual (or individuals, in equal shares) designated by the public safety officer to receive benefits under the most recently executed life insurance policy of the public safety officer on file at the time of death with the public safety agency, organization, or unit;(5) if there is no individual qualifying under paragraph (1), (2), (3), or (4), to thesurviving parent (or parents, in equal shares) of the public safety officer; or(6) if there is no individual qualifying under paragraph (1), (2), (3), (4), or (5), to thesurviving individual (or individuals, in equal shares) who would qualify under the definition of the term

'child' under section 1204 but for age.

#### Public Safety Officer Benefit (PSOB)



 The PSOB program also includes educational assistance through the Public Safety Officer's Educational Assistance (PSOEA).

 Currently, the maximum award for a fulltime student is \$860 per month and proportionately less for part-time students.

#### Public Safety Officer Benefit (PSOB)



 This educational assistance may be used to defray relevant expenses:

## **Federal Legislation**



Hometown Heroes Survivors Benefits Act of 2003:
 Congressman Bob Etheridge introduced HR 5334 in 2002.

Resident signed into law December 15, 2003.

This bill is to ensure that a public safety officer who suffers a fatal heart attack or stroke while on duty shall be presumed to have died in the line of duty.
